Set mainly in the 1900s, the book captures the essence of Malhotra's character as a restless soul always propelled by his desire to look for the deeper truth, greater meaning and more fulfilling connections. As a consequence, he devotes the rest of his life for altruistic purpose, where he finds fulfillment. The story is loosely knit around the experiences drawn from the author's own life. It is a story well told and many readers will see their reflection in it.
